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### 3. Scope of works/Technical specifications

#### Project Background

The South African government has realised that a low carbon economy can bring benefits and in particular it will support climate change mitigation measures. The Government has already committed to reducing carbon emissions in South Africa by 34% by 2020 and 42% by 2025 depending on certain conditions. In order to meet these emissions reduction targets, several strategies will need to be used towards meeting this goal. One such strategy that should be considered is the potential of implementing hybrid energy harnessing technologies, whereby conventional fossil fuel energy technologies are augmented by renewable energies.

Reporting to the Department of Energy, the mandate of the South African National Energy Development Institute (SANEDI) is to serve as a catalyst for sustainable energy innovation, transformation and technology diffusion in support of South Africa's sustainable development. The Cleaner Fossil Fuels Programme houses the South African Centre of Carbon Capture and Storage (SACCCS), a national flagship programme of the National Climate Change Response Strategy White Paper. The Renewable Energy Centre of Research and development (RECORD) supports the mandate of SANEDI within the Renewables Programme.

South Africa's energy and climate change challenges are exacerbated by a reliance on fossil fuels for most of its primary energy supply. Approximately 90% of primary energy is derived from fossil fuels of which ~72% is coal. Moreover, coal provides ~85% of electricity generation capacity and ~92% of electricity production. Coal and gas are also used for the production of liquid fuels amounting to approximately 30% of the liquid fuels used in South Africa. This reliance on fossil fuels has led to ~440Mt CO<sub>2</sub> emissions per year.

South Africa's coal industry contributes significantly to employment opportunities, income generation as well as accounting for 6% of the country's total merchandised exports. Currently, there are two large coal-fired electricity generation stations under construction, namely Medupi and Kusile. South Africa also has a significant requirement for additional energy supply of electricity generation capacity as well as liquid fuel production. Furthermore, there are a multitude of other industries that contribute to national CO<sub>2</sub> emissions

Notwithstanding South Africa's continually increasing implementation of renewable energies and energy efficiency measures, fossil fuels are forecast to remain the major source of primary energy over the medium term.



South Africa is engaged in international climate change negotiations, addressing how to reduce CO<sub>2</sub> emissions, including domestic emissions. During the United Nations Framework Convention for Climate Change Conference of Parties in Copenhagen, the South African President committed the country to lower greenhouse gas emissions – provided that international support in the form of funding and technology was forthcoming to assist with such an action. Such a commitment entails the application of a portfolio of low carbon technologies. It is well known that the major sources of primary energy globally are fossil fuels. However, much of the usable energy available through the burning of coal, for example, is lost in the power station due to physical limitations of conversion efficiencies. If this energy loss could be partially mitigated by hybridisation with renewable energies, then less coal would be combusted to achieve the same electricity output as well as mitigating greenhouse gas emissions.

In 2013 the Australian Renewable Energy Agency (ARENA) conducted a study assessing the potential of hybridisation of fossil fuel energy generation for Australia. They found, for example, that the potential benefits of hybridisation of existing fossil fuel power generation could help to scale-up renewable energy technologies at lower cost than the construction of stand-alone renewable energy power plants. This main benefit could be realised through:

- Using an existing community of energy workers
- Reduced costs due to availability of existing grid connections and transmission infrastructure
- Low risks around environmental permissions
- Potential to re-use steam turbines.

Potential trials of hybrid solutions could also help demonstrate that renewables can supply power reliably, and give current fossil fuel generators experience in operating and maintaining renewable energy plants.

To date, through the REIPPPP (Renewable Energy Independent Power Producers Procurement Programme), many renewable energy sources are coming into the South African energy mix, which is still dominated by fossil fuels. South Africa has one of the best solar regimes in the world and thus the harnessing of electron energy carriers through photovoltaic (PV) technology or just heat energy is an obvious option for the country. Both of these sources have a high potential for hybridisation with the fossil fuel energy generation market. Several areas of focus could be considered:

- Fitting existing power stations with solar PV as a plug and play technology that provide electricity directly to the process.
- Utilising heat generated through solar temperature technology (such as direct heating and concentrating solar power – CSP) in conventional fossil electricity generating processes.
- Utilising heat (as obtained above) in the carbon dioxide capture processes that may be

implemented in South Africa, thus reducing the energy load this process would place on a power station.

- Utilising heat in the greenhouse gas emission mitigation processes of a power station
- Augmenting electricity output to the grid by increasing energy output of a power station with a PV plant. This could maintain the stability of the energy output level of a power station.

All of the above could also be applied in the liquid fossil fuels manufacturing industry of South Africa. By implication, this then leads to infrastructure development towards a more diverse, secure energy supply market and therefore local industry, job creation and skills development.

SANEDI is well placed both nationally and internationally to implement such a project as they would have the support of global bodies in doing so. For example, SANEDI is already a partner in a number of the International Energy Agency's (IEA) specialised implementing agreements that inter alia share information and learning at a global level.

The outputs of this project would be an appraisal of the potential for implementing solar energy in the fossil fuel energy industry of South Africa, addressing inter alia technical feasibility, economic feasibility, advantages and disadvantages. The study shall comprise workshops with interested and affected persons and make motivated recommendations for what hybrid systems demonstrations could be undertaken in South Africa through preliminary front-end designs and preliminary business plans.

It is expected that the project would follow the deliverable timeline and costing as presented below:

### **Scope of works**

The scope of work for this project will seek to assess and appraise all fossil fuel, renewable energy hybridisation technologies being investigated world-wide and then assess their suitability for implementation in South Africa. The scope of work can be divided into the following work packages.

**Work Package 1:** Evaluate existing FF chains in SA and where RE can replace a component/portion of this

- Replacement (replace some of the fossil fuels with renewable energy)
- Augmentation (enhance some of the internal energy requirements with RE)
- Boost (increased output for external sales)

### **Work Package 2:** Focal technologies

The contractor should make an assessment of RE/FF hybrid technologies, some examples of which are listed below, and any other identified technologies.

- Solar (heat and/or electricity)
  - Solar water heating systems (industrial-scale)
  - Commercial solar heat (e.g. industrial heat requirements)
  - Solar electricity (PV, CSP, etc.)
  - Solar chemistry
- Wind (electricity, mechanical)
- Biomass (woody, grasses, algae, invasives, etc.)
  - Pyrolysis
  - Charcoal processes
  - Torrefaction
  - Microbial digestion
- Co-firing
- Ocean energy (thermal gradient, tidal, salinity, wave, current)
- Hydro energy

Any other technologies that are considered important for inclusion by the contractor. The assessment should include, but not be limited to, a description of the technology and economic feasibility as well as their suitability for introduction to South Africa. This should not simply be a scan of available literature; the consultant should provide an assessment of how these technologies would be implemented within a hybrid energy system.

**Work Package 3:** Review current global and SA status and future plans

- Feasibility study on technologies that are being considered/tested/implemented and recommendation/identification which of the technologies discussed under WP2 should be considered in addition to the current ones being studied.
- Showcase success factors, hurdles/challenges, economics
- Global projects terminated and why?

The contractor should also assess whether some of the technologies discussed under 2 should be considered in addition to those identified as focal technologies in WP3.

**Work Package 4:** Techno-economic review

- User case studies
- Quantify economic and technical feasible displacement of fossil fuels through RE interventions
- What level of technology penetration would be needed to make a significant difference by the implementation of FF/RE hybrids in SA

**Work Package 5:** Workshop 1 with Stakeholders [as identified by SANEDI]

- Workshop to be held at about 40% time mark of the project
- Presentation of Study results obtained to that point

- Discussion of current results and identification of gaps and areas of further study
- Outputs of workshop to be used to make any “mid-course” corrections

**Work Package 6: Workshop 2 with Stakeholders [as identified by SANEDI]**

- Presentation of Study results
- Discussion and convergence/recommendations on technologies that could be given consideration to be piloted in South Africa
- Outputs of workshop to be used as inputs to the Final Report recommendations

**Work Package 7: Administration**

The Contractor shall:

- Record written minutes of each Project Steering Committee
- Circulate all minutes within 5 working days of the meeting
- Produce Progress Reports to be addressed at progress meetings

## 5 Tax Clearance Requirements
